

Our offertory this week is one of over 200 choral arrangements collaboratively created between [Alice Parker](#) (b. 1925) and Robert Shaw (1916-1999). They wrote these selections between 1950-1967 for seventeen RCA Victor Recordings made by the [Robert Shaw Chorale](#).

Wondrous Love is a traditional Christian folk hymn, originally set using [shape note notation](#) in the mid 1800s. The familiar melody originated from an 18th Century English ballad.

Long before Isaac Watts began to Christianize the Psalms, Martin Luther had already done so when he created the text and tune for this, his most famous hymn, which is based on Psalm 46. Luther encouraged metrical versions of psalms as well as chanted psalms and new hymns.

Great Prayer of Thanksgiving

This great thanksgiving is a translation of the ancient eucharistic prayer of St. Hippolytus of Rome, dating from about 215. It is the earliest known text of a eucharistic prayer.

Sanctus

The *Sanctus* (Latin), Holy (English) is found in the fourth century ancient Roman Rite is directly inspired by the Prophet Isaiah's vision of God's glory (Isaiah 6:3). This prayer may have been used in the synagogue before Christianity.

Agnus Dei

The Agnus Dei (Latin) for "Lamb of God" (John 1:29). The Syriac (the Church of the East) custom of a chant to the Lamb of God was introduced into the Roman Rite by Pope Sergius I (687-701).

Written around 60 AD, The Didache is a first century discipleship manual, written in the Greek of the New Testament. And is the earliest explanation of communion outside of our New Testament.
